Dastor's Message 🎤

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The start of a new year – it's a time of new beginnings and new adventures. A time to celebrate the end of the past year and look forward to and welcome all that the new year and God holds in store for us.

As I reflect back on 2022, I realize it was a year of great change for me on a personal level and for UFLC as a community of faith. On a personal level, I began as a fledgling vicar, successfully completed the synod candidacy approval process, celebrated 22 years of marriage with my husband Brian, graduated from seminary, was called as your full-time pastor, ordained, and almost installed (don't worry, that's happening in 2023!). As a church, 2022 included an intense clean out schedule for both church buildings, meeting with a realtor and putting the St. Paul's building on the market, fielding an offer practically before the ink had dried on the listing documents, holding final services of both congregations, finalizing the sale of the St. Paul's building, the official consolidation of St. Paul's and Good Shepherd into United Fellowship Luther-an Church, calling a full-time pastor, and hiring UFLC staff – some familiar faces, some new. Whew! We have been BUSY!! But there is still much to do!

2023 will see the official recognition of UFLC by the bishop and the synod as a new congregation of the ELCA, as well as the installation of your new pastor (that's me!). It will continue to be a year of firsts as we build and create new traditions. It will be a year that will see the re-opening of the senior center, A Place to Belong, as well as the completion of several new capital improvements to our building. I pray it will also be a year of growth in community outreach and impact, growth in participation of members in activities, Bible studies, ministries of the church, assisting with worship, financial giving, and of course the hope of growth of membership. But most importantly, my prayer is that we continue to keep God and Christ Jesus at the center of all we do.

We don't know everything the new year will hold for us – either personally or as a church – but we can trust that God is in control of it all. Through prayer and reflection, we can better discern what direction God wants us to move in so that we are best equipped to fulfill God's will for this great adventure of life that we are


same birthday month or even the same day! If you have any questions please see Debbie Mangino or any Fellowship Committee member.

This year we celebrate the Epiphany of Our Lord on January 6th.
