Pastor's Wessage

Dear Siblings in Christ,

October was a month full of ups and downs for me. Returning home from a week's vacation in Niagara Fall, Ontario, with my husband, Brian, I was refreshed and awash in the wonder of God's amazing and beautiful creation. For about 48 hours. Then Covid laid me out for close to a week. While I am feeling better overall, I am still dealing with a lot of fatigue, all while trying to make up for my time out of the office. I have found myself feeling a bit dispirited, a bit low – which is unusual for me. This realization prompted me to stop and engage in some intentional self-reflection, prayer and devotional reading.

One particular reading reminded me that God is always with us. Seems kind of obvious, but sometimes we forget that God is always waiting for us to lay our burdens down at God's feet. Waiting for us to open our hearts and pour out our joys and our sorrows and everything in between. God is always listening. When we are feeling low we tend to curl *into* ourselves instead of reaching *out* to God, who always has arms extended in our direction.

As Reformation Sunday approaches, I am reminded that just as Luther sought reformation within the church, we should seek reformation in our own faith journeys and faith communities. As our faith continues to grow and change, so should our thoughts and our faith disciplines. If those things remain static, they become stagnant and so does our faith. Sometimes this happens to us without our noticing it until we feel off-kilter or unfulfilled. Realigning ourselves with God and Christ Jesus reforms us, refocuses us, more fully opening us to the joy and love that can be found basking in the presence of our Almighty and Everlasting God.

As we journey through the coming month, may we pause to remember all the faithfully departed who have gone before us and may we be reminded of all that God has given to us and be thankful.

2023 Midweek Advent Service Schedule Donations/Offering

We will be joining with St. John's, St. Paul's III, Arndts, and St. Andrew's for the Midweek Advent meal and worship services this season. The soup meal will be offered at 6pm and worship begins at 7pm. The schedule is as follows:

We are asking for donations of hygiene items that will be used to create hygiene kits. These kits are going to be donated to **Project HOPE** of the *St. Luke's AIDS/HIV Clinics of Easton and Bethlehem*. We will also be taking a monetary offering which will be provided to the clinic for the purchase of other materials they need.

What is Project HOPE?



Project HOPE is a Ryan White grant-funded, comprehensive HIV program, with a focus on serving uninsured and under-insured individuals. **HOPE** provides patients with clinical care, which includes primary care and infectious disease care, along with ancillary support services such as nutritional care, behavioral health services, and spiritual care; medical case management services, which includes housing assistance; and HIV/STI prevention services, which includes a free STD clinic and HIV/STI testing in the community, outreach and education, and a linkage to care team. With full comprehensive services located in Bethlehem and Easton, and case management and housing services in Tannersville and Allentown respectively, **HOPE** strives to provide **Health**, **O**utreach, **P**revention, and **E**ducation to patients and the community utilizing a holistic approach to end stigma and discrimination for people living with HIV.

INGATHERING 2023

The Ingathering is a longstanding tradition of Lutheran congregations in the Northeastern Pennsylvania (NEPA) Synod, in which congregations gather items for less fortunate individuals and families. All collected donations benefit local charities and shelters, such as Safe Harbor Easton, ProJeCt of Easton, Bright Hope Easton, and others. This year Ingathering will be held at Hope Lutheran Church in Tatamy on Wednesday, December 6th.

United Fellowship has been asked to provide 150 cans of shaving cream and 50 disposable razors.

They will also be collecting toys, puzzles, hats, gloves, towels, blankets, and bedding in new or very good used condition. Cleaning supplies and adult sized socks and sweatshirts will also be collected.
